
## MATT OLDS!

# YOU are important to the body of Christ!

This past weekend I had the privilege of taking our 4th and 5th graders to CIY SuperStart in Chicago. I want to thank everyone for your prayers! I could certainly feel them. The kids had a great time and I think that the chaperones did as well. One thing that really stood out to me about this weekend was how the kids treated one another.



We meet every Wed, and inevitably there are issues that arise with 13 kids. Sometimes we have little disagreements or squabbles. Not very often, but occasionally Linda, Tiffany, or I will have to take the kids aside and talk to them about how we treat each other.

Last week on Wed, I was trying to decide what we would do for youth group and I remembered that Le' Baxter had donated some gingerbread cookies. I thought it would be a good treat to go with a lesson on 1 Corinthians 12:12-27, talking about unity and diversity in the body. We talked about how we each bring our own unique gifts to the table and how one person is no more important than another, and how we can not function as a body when we are missing parts.

Are you struggling with this? Do you feel like you aren't an important part of the body? Do you sometimes feel like you are more important than other parts? This is a pretty deep lesson, and I'm sure that I have struggled with every one of these issues at certain times in my walk. There was a period of time in my 20's where I was depriving the body of my gifts. I didn't think it was important for me to be at church. There were times that I was very involved and thought the body couldn't survive without me. I love how 1 Corinthians 12:12-27 talk about how we are all parts of the body. Verse 26 says "If one part suffers, every part suffers with it: if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it."



This weekend my 4th and 5th graders acted like this. They sought out those that were sitting by themselves and surrounded them with love before they even had a chance to be sad. They spoke encouraging words to each other. They showed love and compassion to one another. I even had a kid bring snacks, and remember that another kid couldn't have sugar, so they brought sugar free candy. BROTHERS AND SISTERS!!! PAY ATTENTION!!! Are we this kind to one another? Do we treat each other like equal parts of the body? We can learn a lot from these kids. I know that I learn far more from them, than what I teach them! I am so blessed to work with these amazing kids! Spend some time this week thinking about your gifts and how you can share them with the body. YOU are an important part of the body of Christ.

#### **Parent Child Dedication**

On Mother's Day each year we give parents an opportunity to dedicate their children, usually newborn children, to Jesus. This is NOT a salvation ceremony, but simply a ceremony in which parents can declare their intent to raise their



child to know and love Jesus and the church can declare its intent to hold the parents accountable and to provide the environments that will help the parents be successful on their journey.

We are altering the program slightly to include not just children that have been born since last Mother's Day, but to include those parents with young children who may have never had the opportunity to dedicate their children to Jesus. It may be a family new to faith or new to church in general. We are also changing the name to "Parent Child Dedication," as opposed to "Baby

Dedication." This is as much a ceremony for the parents as it is for the children.
