



Power of Prayer

I posted about this on Facebook a couple of weeks ago, but it stood out so profoundly to me that I wanted to share it again.

I was driving my son to his tutoring session in rapid city a few weeks ago. His sessions are an hour long, so I usually go to a park and either read, catch up on phone calls, go for a walk, or get some work done. On this particular day I really felt like going for a walk. I prepared that morning, by wearing comfortable clothes, and my tennis shoes. I usually spend the drive over chatting with my son but I was very distracted this day. The sky was getting very dark and I realized, for the first time all day, that there was a storm brewing. Not one raindrop fell but the sky was a very somber color of gray and something felt off. It made me take notice and pay attention. I started thinking about my walking plans, and realized that those plans were off. I had daydreamed about this



walk. I was planning a good talk with God. I love to pray while walking or running by myself because it is good alone time. Even though I am alone, I inevitably get distracted by things as I'm walking and while I have good intentions I usually go from praying to looking around and wondering about something and before you know it I am mentally planning what to make for dinner. In that moment, on that gloomy day, driving to rapid city, I felt Gods presence very strongly. I knew that I need to spend the hour in prayer. WOW GOD! I CAN FEEL YOUR PRESENCE.

I thought to myself, If I'm going to spend an entire hour, I should see if anyone has any prayer requests. So after my son got out of the car, I parked and got on facebook to post and see if anyone needed prayers for anything. The very first thing that popped up was my sisters feed asking for people to pray for a little boy that had cancer. They weren't just asking for prayer. They were asking for people to sign up for an hour....WOW GOD! I SEE YOU! That hour was open so I signed up for it and saw this post from my sister. Here are 10 guidelines to praying for an hour because it can seem daunting before you dig in!

Lisa Seeley - July 21st at 8:53am - It just dawned on me that I KNOW most of you are praying, but praying for an hour might feel like someone's asking you to run a marathon and you've barely mastered a mile. If praying for a whole hour feels like a daunting task, here are some tips that have helped me:

- 1. Find a place free of distractions! This may be hard for those of you with children, but then maybe the time of day will determine whether you can find a quiet place.
- 2. Speaking of time of day- if you aren't a morning person, don't try to do it in the morning! Pick a time when you have available brain cells.
- 3. Back to the distraction thing- either don't have your phone with you, or have it on silent and only on hand if you're needing to look up a verse or something as part of your prayer time.
- 4. Set a timer- not to make it a ritualistic check off the box activity, but the purpose would be so you aren't constantly checking the time. If you have a timer set you can just chill.
- 5. Have your Bible handy. Prayer is a 2 way conversation between you and God. He might put something in your heart you feel prompted to look up.
- 6. Have a notebook and pen handy. When God does put something on your heart, write it down. Or you can also write down what you wanted to pray for in the first place. For example, yesterday during my time I wrote down John's name with some specifics, Ashley's name, Josh's name, and Bens name- each with specific prayers- so that if I got lost or couldn't think, I could stay focused and remember what I was praying for!
- 7. Treat it like an appointment that you aren't gonna ditch. If you had a meeting with your boss scheduled, you wouldn't skip it, show up late, or leave early.
- 8. If God is putting something in your heart to pray about or think about other than John, it's okay- go with it. If you've been reading Ashley's posts you will be assured she is as much if not more concerned about your relationship with God as she is about Johns cancer. (Which is inspiring btw).
- 9. Relax- God is not evaluating you or judging you, nor is anyone else. If you try to do this and can only make it for 5 minutes....it's okay! God is after your heart, He is not keeping a time sheet (even though I used the boss analogy before....he's a forgiving boss!) So, no pressure and be patient. Think about the couch to 5K program- it takes a while to build stamina and endurance in your prayer life too, but just like with running, it helps to practice!
- 10. Every list has to have 10 things, so....yeah- here is 10.

I Love how God uses other people in our lives to speak to us! I began to pray and during that prayer, one of the most spectacular storms raged around me. I am normally terrified of storms. During that hour of prayer I felt nothing but Gods glory and power around me. When the hour was up, and my timer went off the storm

subsided. I got out of the car to get my son and never had a raindrop touch me. The storm was over. WOW GOD! YOU ARE RIGHT HERE WITH ME!!!!!

God is always right here with us! We just need to take the time to get closer to him. Trust me, you will know he is there! I urge you to take some time for him. Real, intentional, reserved, and special time for him.


