They had stories to tell for generations because they had seen the power of cooperation and what happens when God shows up to put His stamp of approval on people working together. 
THE NEXT VOLUNTEER!

Injecting Life Into A Familiar Story

Our new sermon series starts Sunday. We will be covering chapters 14, 15, and half of 16 of the Gospel of Mark. As a Christian it is easy to fall into a contentment trap when it comes to living a life that reflects our love for Jesus, as well as when it comes to inviting people into a relationship with Jesus. Easter is one of the most effective times to invite someone to church as that Sunday usually breaks the attendance record at churches all over the country. Last year we had over 600 people in attendance on Easter Sunday. I am excited about our sermon series that will take us to Easter because our planning team has come up with some creative ideas as to how to visually relay the message we want to convey.

This past Sunday we talked about staying **AWAKE** (Always Walking Alongside the King Eternal). The point of the message is that we, as Christians, are called to be Christians 24/7. Jesus' message to the Apostles at the end of chapter 13 was for them to stay awake because they don't know when the Son will come again.



Chapters 14-16 are the real motivation for staying awake and for inviting people to meet Jesus. In those chapters we see the love that God truly has for us in that He sent Jesus to die for us. In the text it reads as a story of a man who is crucified after being wrongly accused of blasphemy. However, when you couple the text of chapters 14-16 with **Romans 5:8** we realize that He died for you and me, even though we don't deserve it.

I hope we have 800 people this Easter. I hope that the messages covering these three chapters challenge each of us to not grow content, but to keep seeking how we might serve God in new and exciting ways, and I hope that the creativity in our planning is helpful to everyone in desiring to be here and in learning about God's love for us. But my biggest desire is that we read Mark 14-16 from the lens of Romans 5:8 and are never the same people again. Both those who come as surrendered believers and those who come not knowing or believing in Jesus. See you Sunday.
