Congratulations to Josh Hoppe - our KCC Volunteer of the week!

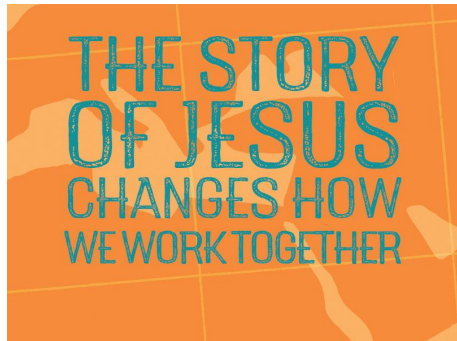

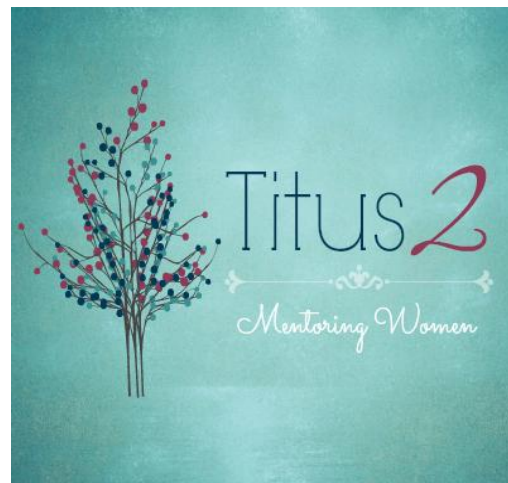
Upcoming Events
