
Training for KCC Volunteers

If you are new to Planning Center, come learn how to set up your account, block out dates, set up text reminders, and ask questions about the new online system for communicating with KCC volunteers! **Wednesday, June 29th at 6:00pm** in the Green Room.

Set up your account to receive notifications via text! (Hint: all you have to do is add your Cell Phone Carrier to your Mobile #!)

- 1. Log into your PCO account.
- 2. Click on your name in the upper right, then Profile from the drop-down menu.
- 3. On the Communications tab, click on Edit button in the Text Notifications section.
- 4. Add a Mobile Phone number (if necessary) and your phone Carrier.
- 5. Click Save at the bottom of the window.
- Select the Scheduling Requests and Reminders check boxes. It saves your preferences automatically.

That's it! Now you will receive text notifications regarding scheduling & reminders.


SUZANNA LABBATE!


KIDSTUF is <u>THIS SUNDAY at 11:00am</u> in the Lower Level for all kids Kindergarten through 5th Grade!




Lessons from a Tomato and a Cucumber

This one is called, "Me, Myself, and Bob." It was written by a guy named Phil Vischer, who was the creator of Veggie Tales, the children's Bible videos. I enjoyed it so much, in fact, that after I was done I reached out to his people to see what it would take to have him come preach in an upcoming sermon series. I haven't heard back yet, but I doubt I was able to offer enough money to make it worth his while, not to mention that I was hoping to have him come in July. Not exactly a whole bunch of notice.

Anyway, back to the book. Toward the end of the book (spoiler alert), Vischer said something that really hit me. I am paraphrasing, but he said something to the effect that where he will be in five years is none of his business. And when asked what his desire for his company, "Big Idea productions," was, he said, "I want to be in the center of God's will." The point he was making was that the future is not something we can control. What we can control or



choose to do is to live each and every moment and day where we know God would want us to be living. If God wants us in a different job, He can put us there. If He wants us to move, He can show us that, too. However, to worry about it, or to work on securing the future, is unnecessary and futile as God owns the future not us.

As a leader at KCC it is easy to look ahead and put all of these plans in place for my desired results. However, what I really need to do is to make plans for today for how our church can love and worship God and to love our neighbor as ourself. And let God take care of the future.




