Looking for men or young men who will pass the Sunday morning communion plates and collect the offering.




• Computer Check-In

CHRIST INSPIRED

When the elders and I met last fall to have a retreat and talk about the current state of the church and propose what the next steps should be in being the church God called us to, the phrase we developed was..."Christ Inspired." In the beginning of this calendar year I was

trying to decide what that equated to as far as an action. However, as we have studied the book of Mark it became more clear to me that "Christ Inspired" means that we shape this church to do as Christ did. I have shared these things before at our annual meeting as well as in a sermon recently, but here they are again: A Christ Inspired church will study God's Word so as to teach God's Word, be in a discipleship relationship, have compassion on those we come into contact with, and give of ourselves sacrificially.



Yesterday I dropped by the Northside high school and asked the Principal, "Brian, what is this place? What goes on here?" He gave me a tour of the school and then shared with me some stories about the kids that attend the school. After hearing from he and his administrative assistant I asked the question, "What can we do to help?" His answer, "Just show up. Come hang out with the kids. Get to know them. Most people in our community have no idea what goes on here." The wheels started turning in my head as to what we can do as a church to connect with the school. I have several ideas, but the first one is that I need to go over, take some cookies during their lunch time, and just hang out.

Being present doesn't take an army of people. Being present doesn't take a program. Being present doesn't take hours of our time. Being

present is one moment of compassion, living sacrificially, and connecting to another of God's creation. When I was leaving, a young man was standing at the door waiting for his ride and said something to the effect of, "I don't know what I would do without this school here. It's a great place."

I know that we, as a church, need to show up at all of the schools and connect to the greater school system and show them God's love. But I identify most with Northside because that is who I see myself as being before Christ. Before my relationship with him, I was a sinner that deserved being given up on. Because of God's love, I was given a second chance. Let's show up for our community living Christ Inspired lives and being God's second chance by sharing the Gospel.
