

KCC's VBS kids help kids in Haiti!


A Huge Thank you to all of the kids at Vacation Bible School this summer!

They fed grangou, our offering monster and paid for school uniforms for the kids in Haiti! Thank you kids!


KIDSTUF is <u>THIS SUNDAY at 11:00am</u> in the Lower Level for all kids Kindergarten through 5th Grade!




Quilted Devotions
