October 26, 2016





So Saturday was the perfect storm of all of these things. I started paying attention to what I was eating, so I had a healthy breakfast and we got in the car to go to my son's cross country meet. On the way to Gaylord, I made a mental decision to not spend the car ride on my phone. I was looking out the window and talking to God, and decided that I really need to be better about that. The rest of the car ride was pleasant as we gave my son some motivational speeches about his race. After his race, which he had a PR (Personal Record) of 19:39 for a 5k, we had a nice ride home and enjoyed spending time together.

When we got home I surveyed my living room (see previous paragraph about becoming more organized) and decided that I could wait to tackle the living room, and that I should go for a run. Feeling quite motivated by watching all of these high schoolers running, I set off for my longest run in a long time. I've been part of the Run for God bible study on Wed nights and we have gone from



running 60 second intervals to now running 8 minutes in a row. I took a good 10 minutes getting ready for my run. I changed my clothes, made sure that my hair was pulled up, grabbed a hat because it was chilly, and got my running sleeve for my phone.

I ALWAYS run with my phone. I have an app that tells me when I can stop running and when it beeps, I know that I'm allowed to walk. I literally can't mentally do it without this app. Anyone who has ever run with me knows this. So I secure my phone on my forearm and take off for my longest run to date.

I like to talk when I run....well if I can breathe that is! Some people like to listen to music or podcasts, but I like to talk. So when I run by myself, I talk to God. Well I had a lot to discuss with him on Saturday. I was mentally preparing for Sunday, and also thinking about being more plugged in to my family. I was trying really hard not to look at how much longer I had to run. I checked a sneak peek and only had 2 minutes left. "You can do this Sara!" I said aloud to myself. Philippians 4:13 "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me" (I forgot, I talk to myself a lot too!) As I dodged some roadkill on the road and looked forward I tried to guess which telephone pole I had to make it to for my 8 minutes to be up, when I felt something whizz past my arm. In horror I turned around and saw my phone on the dirt road....shattered.



I felt like crying. I was out here trying to run, and do something good and now I was without a phone. I instantly went into a panic. What if I needed to call someone, how would I know when I could walk. I decided that I should just turn around, when the familiar beep beep beep, of my running app went off. OH! The sound was still working...I guess I can keep going.

So I finished my run, came into the house and pouted for a little bit, until I remembered what I had been praying about all morning. I had to laugh! Sometimes we use

things in our lives as a crutch. Do I really need my phone to run? NO! Do I really need to check Facebook every 20 minutes to see what everyone else is up to? NO! Do I really need to be spending more time with my family and with God? YES! Praise God for his subtle and sometimes not so subtle communication with us! While going through this involuntary phone fast, I've found tons of time to clean my house, spend time with my family, and try to spend more time in prayer...(I'm not gonna lie, I miss my Bible app on my phone desperately). I encourage you to find the things that are a distraction for you and try to limit them. Find more time for what is really important in life.
