Another Tough Question

Someone sent the question in, "Are generational curses still relevant? If so, how are they broken?" The question stems from an Old Testament Scripture in Exodus 34:6-7 that reads, "The Lord passed before him and proclaimed, 'The Lord, the Lord, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness, keeping steadfast love for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin, but who will by no means clear the guilty, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children and the children's children, to the third and the fourth generation."



And the answer I would give is "yes" and "no." How is that for wishy washy? The "yes," I would say, is the fact that every day we are dealing with the curse that came with sin and the consequences of bad decisions and bad behavior of people dating back for generations. Why is work difficult? Why is there pain in childbearing? Because of the curse put on man in Genesis chapter 3. So in that regard, yes we are still under a curse.

However, I think the person who asked the question was being more specific about a particular person's family and whether generations of kids have to deal with the consequences of their parents' sin. The Apostle Paul wrote that, "all who rely on

works of the law are under a curse; for it is written, 'Cursed be everyone who does not abide by all things written in the Book of the Law, and do them'" (Galatians 3:10). This means we're all cursed because none of us can ever keep the Law perfectly or do enough good works to save ourselves. Thankfully, "Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us-for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who is hanged on a tree" (Galatians 3:13).

Because we are freed from the law, no, we are not "paying" the penalty for our family's sin. However, there may be a sin in our family that causes consequences from an earthly standpoint. People may find you "guilty by association" and not hire you for a job or want to be in your company because of a family shame. However, that is NOT a God ordained punishment.


Our action or inaction now can help or hurt the future of our family tree. It is more from cause and effect, however, and not because of a curse from God. When we give our life to Jesus, we are freed from the chains of sin. And while we may still pay consequences on earth because of bad decisions, or so that God can get our attention so we will repent, It isn't a generational curse. Just a reminder that we are here to worship Him and not ourselves.

So, "no" I don't believe there are generational curses today, but there are effects that happen that may be caused by the action of our parents or grandparents. And the best way to break those effects down is to surrender all we do to Jesus and change our family tree to one that grows to be like Jesus. Then the things in our family's past will be a testimony not a label or chain we have to bear. Hope that helps.


LEARN IT


